### Time for a two-player showdown

Sit yourselves down, put your game faces on and get ready for a good, old-fashioned Linkee Duel. Here's how you play:

In this version of the game, both of you are going to be players and Question Masters – so it's double the fun. Both players start by drawing a Question Card. Player A (Ann) starts by reading out Q1 to Player B (Bert). If Bert isn't ready to shout Linkee, he reads out Q1 to Ann. Then they move onto Q2 and keep going until one of them is ready to shout Linkee.

If either Ann or Bert shout "Linkee" and get it wrong, then it's bad news for them. They're out until the next round, giving the other player all the time in the world to think up an answer to their card. Just like the classic rules, the first person to get enough cards to spell out Linkee wins. (Our money is on Ann. She's good.)
